


Exciting Lenten Study/Discussion Starting Feb 14

Henrietta Mann is Professor Emeritus in Native American Studies at Montana State University. *Rolling Stone Magazine* named her one of the top 10 professors in the nation. In *On This Spirit Walk*, which she co-authored with Anita Phillips, a member of the Cherokees from Park Hill, Oklahoma, Mann shares stories of traditions and stories of creation and genesis, plus stories of vision and prophecy.

On This Spirit Walk is a vivid portrayal of these storytellers who "do not choose to be storytellers" but "are chosen to be the Keepers of Living Stories. With our breath, we give life to the stories and they



take flight." These stories include reflections by native people on recent efforts by the United Methodist Church's General Conference of 2012 to engage in an Act of Repentance including confession, repentance and forgiveness for the manner in which religious ideas were forced upon native peoples.


Friday, April 8 Spaghetti Feed and Auction

Hello Christ's Church UMC / PCUSA United, Monmouth,

Thanks for letting us use the Christ's Church parking lot on the first Saturday of December 2015 to distribute Christmas wreaths on behalf of MLP (Mujeres Luchadoras Progresistas), a local farm worker women's cooperative based in Woodburn, OR.

Your congregation is a long time supporter of farm worker rights going back to the 80's and 90's through several members and pastors. A few years back, Diane McBurnett helped organize an immigration forum at Christ's Church. We are grateful for this long-term support and look forward to working with your congregation in the future.

This year we are promoting legislation to raise the minimum wage and protect workers against wage theft in Oregon. Regionally, we are supporting dairy worker safety and Skagit Valley berry worker rights in WA

State. Nationally, we work for comprehensive immigration reform in collaboration with farm labor partners United Farm **Workers and Northwest** Treeplanters and Farmworkers United / PCUN. Islam, Faith, and Culture Series

A number of Christ Church members attended three Sunday night lectures in January at the Lutheran Trinity Church in Dallas. Matt Davies, a professor at Chemeketa Community College, presented the three lectures. Dr. Davies gave an excellent presentation, each time, and I feel, did much to address the beliefs of the Muslin faith as well as promote understanding of this religion without fear.



All three lectures are available through the Dallas Trinity Lutheran Church website at www.dallastlc.org The first is video taped, the other two have only audio recordings at this point but soon will have video, as well. It is known that Matt Davies is willing to present three similar lectures at Christ's Church, perhaps after Easter. Understanding each other's faith is invaluable

The first lecture was on the beliefs held by Muslims. First and foremost is the belief in One God and submission to that God. Davies affirmed that the Muslim faith recognizes the Jewish and Christian are of "the book" and worshipping the same God (Allah). Allah is the Arabic word for God, and is used also by the Christians and Jews-who speak Arabic. Matt gave a very good overview of the requirements of the Muslim faith (the five pillars of Islam).

The second lecture concerned the growth of ISIS. ISIS is not recognized by the leaders of Islam as a legitimate part of the religion. The main leaders of Islam have spoken out against what is being done by this group of radicals and has repudiated ISIS.

The third lecture dwelt with the Muslim Faith in the United States. Islam is all across the states with at least one mosque in each state. Oregon has 12 mosques. Overwhelmingly Muslims support the United States and value their US citizenship. As it is with other religions, including Christianity, there are some radicals that do not follow the teachings and are recruited in a different way. They are an extremely small group compared to the majority, who do not hold ISIS beliefs, and support the suppression of ISIS. One of the basic tenants of the Islam religion is charity and support for those in need, definitely the opposite of what ISIS teaches.

And the greatest is love.



Denominational News for Our World

Annual Presbyterian Assessment - a per capita payment is given each year to the Presbyterian Church by Christ's Church. **The United Methodist Church apportionment** is calculated in a different manner. Stay tuned for more information on that.

Each year a portion of our church budget includes payments to our denominations for shared ministry. Our statistics, both membership and financial numbers, are recorded as half to each denomination as per our church Bylaws. In the Presbyterian denomination the Per Capita is considered an obligation of shared responsibility within a covenant community, the source on funding to support the judicial, administrative, and connectional relationships within the denomination, from the Presbytery to the Synod and General Assembly. Volunteer through http://www.gaportland.com/volunteer-to-help-with-ga/ The Per Capita is calculated by multiplying ½ of our membership at the end of last year with an amount decided by the Presbytery. Christ's Church Per Capita for 2016 is 31 (membership) times \$29.89, which equals \$926.59.








New Central Community Resource Center will be available at the old Central School District Office located between Independence and Monmouth on 16th street, across from the Central High School. The Resource Center will begin to fill a hole in access to social services for residents of Independence and Monmouth. Transportation can make it difficult for people who need social services.

The Center will start being open on Thursdays, one day a week. The Salvation Army, Fostering Hope, HALO Programs, Mano a Mano, Goodwill Jobs Program, Community Action agency, resource center programs, and the Department of Human Services provide services. Dental, medical, childcare, and mental health are also available, five days a week, across the street in the Central Health and Wellness Center.

This will make the corners of Monmouth and 16th Street virtually the hub of social services in Monmouth and Independence. What a boon for people in our communities!
